Many Israeli dates are produced on stolen Palestinian land, grown in illegal Israeli settlements.

Often dates are misleadingly labelled as 'produce of Palestine' to avoid the boycott.

These dates are produced in conditions that are exploitative of dispossessed Palestinians, with low pay, dangerous working conditions and use of child-labour, exploiting the desperation of Palestinian families who have been left with little choice due to Israel's apartheid.

Israel's genocide in the Gaza strip has killed tens of thousands of Palestinians and has destroyed entire neighbourhoods. Israel is continuing its ethnic cleansing across the occupied West Bank.

Palestinians are calling on us to boycott Israeli dates in solidarity with their struggle for freedom.





A guide to boycotting Israeli dates:

- Check the label for country of origin, especially for Medjool dates. Don't buy anything labelled 'produce of Israel', and be suspicious of anything labelled 'produce of Palestine'. Make sure you query the origin before buying.
- Check the barcode if the country of origin isn't visible 729 is for Israel.
