

Poll result shows strong support for a ceasefire in Gaza

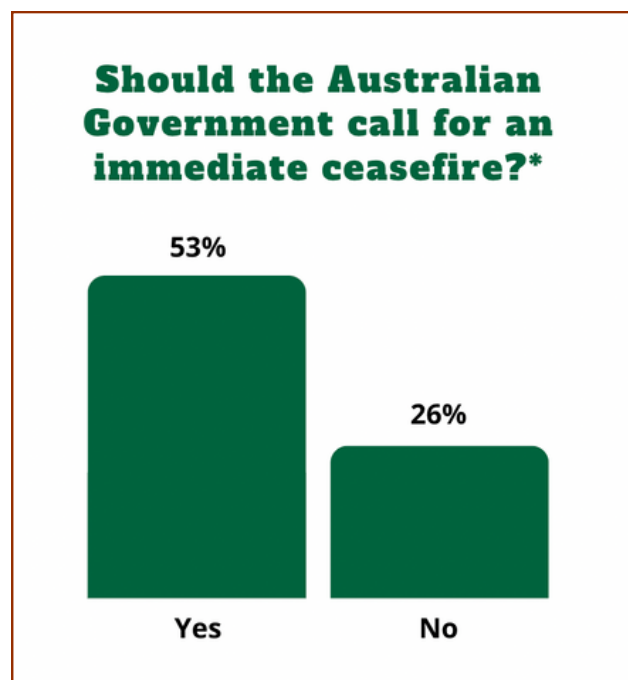
A recent YouGov poll showed a majority of Australians support an immediate ceasefire in Gaza and that 46% of Australians believe Israel's attack on Gaza, cutting supplies of water, fuel, food, electricity and medical supplies, are not reasonable acts of self-defence.

The poll by respected international polling agency YouGov (which also produces newspoll) is weighted to be representative of the Australian adult population.

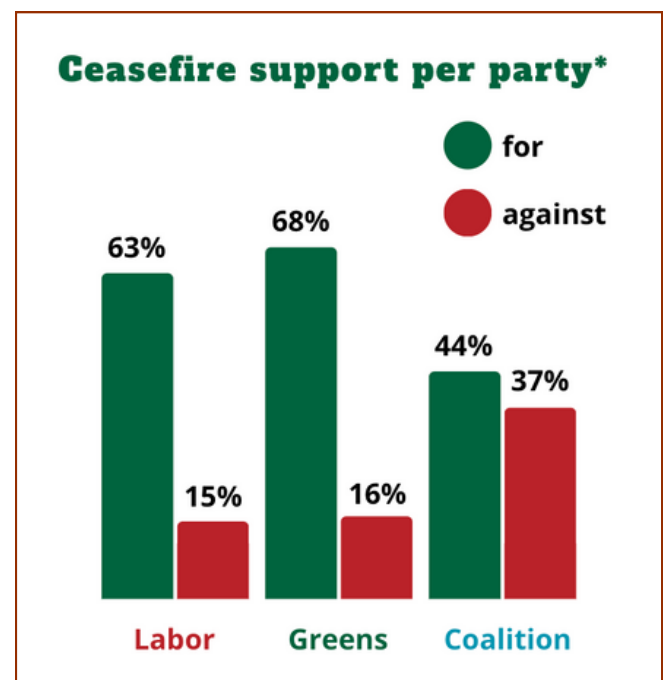

The results

53% of Australians believe the government should call for a ceasefire, while only a **quarter** oppose it.



4 times as many Labor and Greens voters support an immediate ceasefire than oppose it. More Coalition voters (**44%**) support a ceasefire than oppose it.

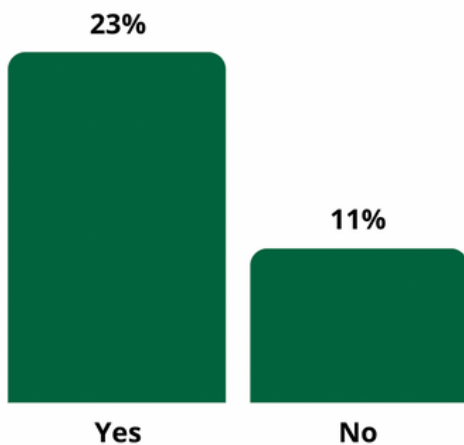

The results continued

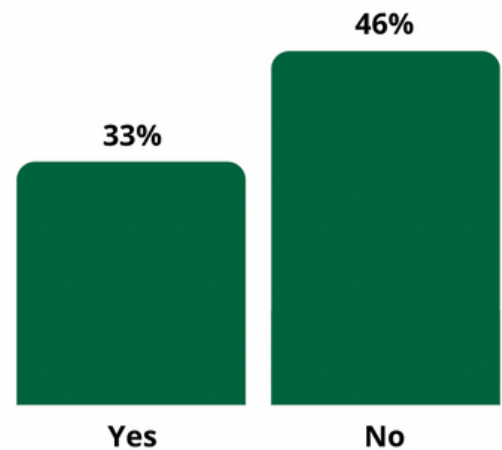
If the government called for a ceasefire in Gaza, **23%** of the population would be more likely to consider voting Labor at the next election as compared to only **11%** who would be less likely to consider voting ALP.

Are you more likely to consider voting for the Labor party if they call for a ceasefire?



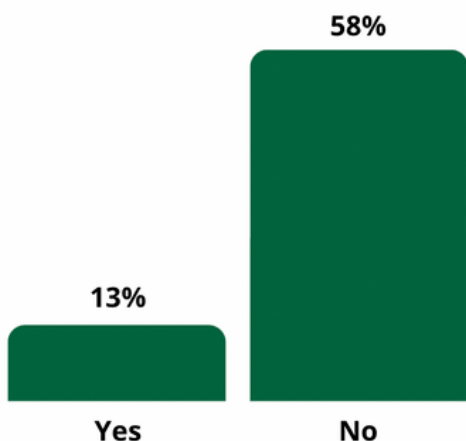
46% of Australians do not believe Israel's attacks on Gaza are reasonable acts of self-defence, while only **33%** do.

58% of young Australians do not believe Israel's attacks on Gaza are reasonable acts of self-defence, while only **13%** do.
